THE VIKING DIFFERENCE IN ANTARCTICA

Innovative ships designed for comfort and exploration

FEW PLACES ARE AS OTHERWORLDLY AS ANTARCTICA, with its raw sculpted landscapes awash in blue and white. Here nature is at its most flawless—an experience sure to transform visitors. The ideal time to explore is the Antarctic summer, starting in November when cold, windy weather turns to 24-hour sunlight and temperatures rise to a comfortable 0° C. The ice melts, unlocking frozen seaways. Activities maximize your interaction and virtually all are included: explore by RIB, kayak, submarine, zodiac and more. Here are some highlights you may experience during your journey:

- Catch a glimpse of Gentoo penguins, Weddel seals and blue whales
- Shore landings offer amazing opportunities for wildlife viewing
- Included RIB excursions present stunning scenery for photos
- Cross-country ski or snowshoe into the peninsula's interior
- Excursions include an undersea dive in a panoramic submarine
- As a citizen scientist, assist onboard scientists with research

AT VIKING, WE OFFER EXPLORATION IN UNPRECEDENTED COMFORT. Sail to Antarctica onboard ships that are appropriately sized and purpose-built for an immersive polar experience. Our expedition ships are small enough to navigate in remote areas, slender enough to pass through canals and large enough to provide speed, superior handling and stability in rough seas.

100% POLAR CLASS

Both *Viking Octantis* and *Viking Polaris* have a Polar Class notation, indicating the ships are designed to travel safely to the polar regions. This means



that, unlike most other travel companies offering expedition voyages, we offer a 100% polar class fleet on voyages to Antarctica.

INCREASED STABILITY & COMFORT

Our expedition ships feature both fin stabilisers and U-tank stabilisers that reduce rolling by nearly 50% when the ships are sailing or stationary. An integrated bow creates a longer waterline for the ships and state-of-the-art fin stabilisers allow the ships to glide over the waves for the calmest possible journey.

In regions where anchoring is not possible, dynamic positioning mode allows our ships to hover in place for more streamlined exploration while preventing damage to the seafloor.

UNIQUE FACILITIES DESIGNED FOR EXPLORATION

An industry first, this enclosed in-ship marina permits the launch of Special Operations Boats through the ship's slipway, in addition to the side doors on Deck A. The Hangar can be used for the embarkation of Special Operation Boats when weather and other conditions allow. Guests can observe activity in The Hangar from windows on Deck 1, watching small boat maintenance

and biosecurity protocols. This space also features FerryBoxes, instruments continuously collecting and displaying data on water quality, oxygen content, plankton composition and more.

MORE THAN JUST AN EXPEDITION SHIP

Our purpose-built expedition ships are fully equipped research vessels. At the core of Viking Expeditions is the goal to undertake meaningful scientific work. With the help of partnerships with esteemed academic institutions we have created the world's leading scientific enrichment environment in an expedition setting.

During each expedition, visiting researchers from partner institutions are part of the 36-person Viking Expedition Team. This diverse group of experts lead guests through meaningful scientific work, providing guidance and interpretation during shore excursions and delivering world-class lectures. The Science Laboratory, complete with wet and dry capabilities allows our scientists to conduct meaningful research while encouraging guest interaction and participation – an experience exclusive to Viking.

THE WILDLIFE OF ANTARCTICA

Watch the drama of life unfold

DESPITE BEING ONE OF THE COLDEST, DRIEST AND DARKEST PLACES ON EARTH, Antarctica is anything but dormant. In this isolated, otherworldly destination where the only resident humans are scientists, diverse wildlife thrives amid the extreme conditions. Animals bustle and thrive under the midnight sun, as native penguin and seal species compress the cycle of life into a short season, and migratory birds and whales take advantage of the ocean's rich bounty. Each day affords a new opportunity to witness nature at work, revealing the resilience and extraordinary adaptations of life in Antarctica's unforgiving landscape.

The "White Continent" offers animal encounters unlike any other destination. Gentoo penguins, leopard seals, orcas and albatrosses regularly grace guests with their presence, while Emperor or King penguin sightings are rare but exhilarating. Expect to witness penguins sliding on the ice and fur seals lazing in the sun. See migratory birds circling overhead, humpback whales breaching or orca pods striking coordinated attacks on their prey. The things you see in this wild, remote corner of the globe will live with you long after you return home.



GENTOO PENGUINS

The world's fastest diving bird, Gentoo penguins can dive at speeds greater than 32 kilometers per hour during their hunt for krill, squid and fish.



ADÉLIE PENGUINS

Spending summers on the islands of Antarctica and the rest of the year on the continent, Adélie penguins dive as far as 180 meters underwater in search of food.



CHINSTRAP PENGUINS

The narrow black band under their chin easily identifies these penguins, and their tightly packed feathers allow them to swim in freezing waters of Antarctica.



MIGRATORY BIRDS

Abundant food makes the Antarctic peninsula a summer home for 35 different species of migratory birds including Antarctic terns, shags, various albatross and petrels.



SEALS

Among Antarctica's population are doe-eyed weddell seals, fierce leopard seals, fur seals and deep-diving elephant seals.



WHALES

Plentiful fish, squid, krill and plankton beckon minke whales, humpbacks and blue whales, while orca pods feast on seals.

WHEN TO VISIT ANTARCTICA

A landscape of differing contrasts

ANTARCTICA HAS TWO SEASONS, summer and winter. During winter Antarctica is plunged into darkness and extreme temperatures and weather conditions prevail while sea ice surrounds the continent rendering it inaccessible.

The ideal time to explore is the Antarctic summer between November and March when the cold, windy weather turns to 24-hour sunlight and temperatures rise to a more comfortable zero degrees celsius and the ice melts, unlocking seaways that were frozen in winter. This is the optimal time to visit, often with relatively open water, clear weather and endless views.

Every month over summer affords an altogether different experience.

NOVEMBER

Pristine snow-covered landscapes and the waters surrounding the peninsula are awash with ice flows and icebergs as the pack ice begins to melt – an opportune time for budding landscape photographers. Whales and migratory birds begin to return and penguins form highways as they migrate up the slopes to build their nests in preparation for raising their chicks. This is also penguin mating season, so courtships are on full display.

DECEMBER/JANUARY

This is Antarctica at its finest. The weather is more stable, days become longer and temperatures increase with January affording 20+ hours of sunlight. The continent and surrounding waters are teeming with life. Penguin rookeries are a hive of new life as chicks begin to hatch. Various species of seals will bask in the sun and keep your eyes peeled upward for albatross, snow petrel and skuas.

FEBRUARY/MARCH

February provides the greatest accessibility for landings and an opportunity to sail across the Antarctic Circle (if weather permits). March is peak whale watching season as whales are feasting on the abundance of krill before their great migration north. By the end of March as winter begins to descend, the days become shorter, the sunsets are spectacular and there’s the potential for fresh snowfalls.

Torstein Hagen discusses his trip to Antarctica

Discover how a childhood fascination with far-flung destinations and a lifelong passion for travel culminated in Viking Chairman and CEO Torstein Hagen's recent expedition to Antarctica on board *Viking Polaris* during this exclusive conversation with award-winning photographer Alastair Miller.

Q: Mr. Hagen, you recently sailed to Antarctica. Did a letter you sent as a child to Ushuaia, Argentina inspire this trip?

A: As a young boy, I used stamps from my collection to mail a letter from my Norwegian home to Ushuaia. The letter was of course returned, and I kept it with me throughout my life, dreaming of one day visiting this faraway place—now the starting point for our Antarctic voyages.

Q: What struck you most about Antarctica?

A: My first and lasting impression is how huge it is. It is so overwhelming. Then, of course, you have the colours, the whites, the blues, of various shades. It is unlike anywhere else.

Q: Is this journey suitable for any adult?

A: If I can do this trip, anyone can.

Q: What wildlife did you see, and what activities did you do ashore?

A: We saw lots of penguins and came very close to whales. I also had my famous letter with me, which I got stamped at Port Lockroy.

Q: Can you describe some of the stateroom features of *Viking Polaris*?

A: We have taken a lot of care to design the vessel for the environment in which it operates. Our Nordic Balcony staterooms provide a shelf at elbow level to stabilise binocular viewing or photography and warming closets for your gear.

Q: Can guests participate in scientific research on the ship?

A: Yes, there is The Science Lab with experts from various fields. I value scientific endeavours, being a physicist myself. Guests can learn about research efforts and engage with onboard scientists.

Q: Did you take any pre- or post-cruise extensions?

A: As a matter of fact, we went to Iguazú Falls and got soaking wet. It was like being a child again.

Q: Any advice for someone considering an Antarctic trip?

A: I would do it again.

Follow in the wake of the great explorers, including Captain James Cook, who traversed these waters, remains one of the least visited places on Earth.

DAY 8-10 **EXPLORE SOUTH GEORGIA**
South Georgia with its rugged landscapes, mountainous hillsides and spectacular glaciers, remains one of the least visited places on Earth.

DAY 11 **SAIL THE SOUTH ATLANTIC OCEAN**
Sail the legendary waters of the South Atlantic Ocean, where intrepid explorer Sir Ernest Shackleton navigated the fateful voyage of the Endurance, which resulted in her sinking in Antarctic waters in 1915.
